Triple Threat

Sagging skin, brown spots, wrinkles those three things alone can all make us look tired and just plain old. Now, there's a new treatment that targets all those problems at once. Seven's Diana Diaz shows us this Triple Threat for aging faces.

Rachel Zelcher: "I wanted the face lift without anything invasive."

Dr. Mark Sachs, Cosmetic Surgery Associates: "It's a triple threat that works at all different levels of the skin to produce a total facial rejuvenation."

The first laser is the IPL laser, which targets freckling and sun damage.

Dr. Mark Sachs: "The second laser is the ST laser. It induces the production of collagen and tightens the collagen that is already present in the face. The third laser the MATRIX IR produces fractionated light, which works deeply to etch out

fine lines and wrinkles."

You'll need three treatments spaced four weeks apart. There is no downtime and results are supposed to be long-lasting.

Dr. Mark Sachs: "You can put off a facelift for years and even potentially forever."
